Dear Parents and Students.

We hope you have had an exciting school year. We are looking forward to working with you again next year.

Grades 6 through 8 at TMS are organized in teams of teachers. Each grade has two teams, grades 6 and 7 have five teachers on each team: a math teacher, social studies teacher, science teacher and two English language arts teachers, grade 8 has four teachers: a math teacher, social studies teacher, science teacher and one English language arts teacher. The main function of the team is to plan, carry out and evaluate each student's instructional program. Your child's schedule will be mailed home in late August.

I would like to make you aware of some important resources available to you here at TMS:

- The school's web-site, accessed at http://www.tms.tolland.k12.ct.us has the Digital Backpack, calendars, menus, athletic and club schedules, important notices, and teacher web-sites with weekly updates.
- Students are provided individual agenda booklets. You do not need to purchase an assignment book or calendar for your son or daughter, as one is provided to every student. In addition to a class organizer and calendar, it contains useful information such as the school calendar and the Parent and Student Handbook, all in one. This agenda functions as a daily assignment booklet and a place for home/school communications. Students are required to bring this to and from school, and to all classes daily. This system promotes student responsibility and accountability, and helps foster organizational skills. We thank you for your support of this school wide agenda system.

Your child's schedule will be mailed home during the last week of August. The first day of school for all Tolland students is Wednesday, August 29, 2017. This will be a full, regular day. Open House for Grade 6 is scheduled for Thursday, September 6, 2018, and Grades 7 and 8 Open House is scheduled for Wednesday, September 12, 2018. More information about these nights will be sent in the fall. At that time we will describe our curriculum and instructional programs.

If your child is interested in participating in interscholastic sports, please make note of the following information. Registration and submission of physical forms must be completed through FamilyID.com for each sport, prior to the deadlines below. To register your child and to find the proper sports medical forms, please visit the athletics page of the TMS website and click on the "Athletic Participation Registration and Forms" tab. Upon successful submission of your registration you will receive a confirmation email from FamilyID notifying you that your child has been registered. The registration is automatically removed from the database at 12:01 a.m. the morning following the deadline. Please see our website for more information and eligibility requirements.

Summer Reading Assignment



Dear Parents,

The summer reading assignment for students entering sixth grade in the fall is as follows:

- 1. We recommend that each child read at least five books during the summer; however, there is a minimum requirement of one age appropriate book.
- 2. Keep a log of the books that have been read during the summer. Every 150 pages is equal to one book. For example, a book of 600 pages equals four books.
- 3. The parent signature is an acknowledgment that the pages were read.
- 4. Watching a movie based on a book does not count for this assignment.

This assignment will count as the first homework assignment in reading class.

The book log must be turned in on or before the first Friday of school. A book log is attached to
this letter; however students may also use the Governor's Summer Reading Log or the Tolland
Public Library's Log as long as the title, author, and number of pages read are provided.

We hope that allowing students to choose their own books will make their summer reading enjoyable while keeping their reading skills fresh.
